For our History topic this term, we have been learning all about the Stone Age!


We went on a trip to Hamstead Heath and learnt about how the people of the Stone Age used to live.

In English, we have been reading 'Stone Age Boy'. We went on an adventure around the school to look for a mammoth. We also got to write instructions on how to catch a woolly mammoth and a recount of the story!







Year 4



In English, we read a fascinating and emotional book called 'The Boy at the Back of the Class', which is about a refugee boy called Ahmet. We learnt so much about the lives of refugees and feel that there should be more done to help support them!

We had a visit from a special guest - Miss Farah's mum, who was a refugee! She told us all about her journey from Somalia to the UK after the civil war. We had the chance to ask her questions, just like reporters, which helped us write our own newspaper reports.





October Gallery landscapes

Year 4 went on an incredible trip to The October Gallery, where they learnt about the sculptor El Anatsui. The children were inspired by his depictions to produce their own mountainous landscapes. This linked well to their topic for the term of Magnificent Mountains.

Year 5

What a busy half-term this has been! One of the highlights in Year 5 this half term was DT Week, when we worked, in teams, on a DT project, planning and creating magnificent marble runs using recycled materials. We were constantly evaluating our progress and had to make a LOT of adjustments so that our runs would work efficiently. There were many failures before our triumphant successes!










Our Geography topic this half term was Raging Rivers. We learned a rap to help us understand and explain the water cycle, then located key rivers around the world and discovered interesting facts about them. We also explored how rivers change shape over time. Another memorable event was Map Skills Day, which was a fantastic opportunity to build on our knowledge of the different types of maps that exist and their uses. We revised compass points and applied the knowledge to locating major towns and cities in the UK.

This term, we have learnt about World War 2. For our school trip, we went to the Royal Air Force Museum. We saw many different types of planes, including boat planes, Spitfires, missile planes and a Blackhawk! When we entered, we went to an amazing workshop where a lady showed us a (diffused) pneumatic bomb which gets hot when it's dropped. Soon after, we reacted to an air raid siren, quickly rushing to an air raid shelter for safety.

We learnt that the war began when Adolf Hitler invaded Poland. When Germany refused to withdraw their troops, England and France declared war on Germany. Also, we learnt about different types of food that were rationed, such as meat, eggs, cheese, margarine, jam, tea, sugar and sweets. Some of our work on topic day was to decide which food was most important to us!

Year 6 were honoured to help out at the Winter Fair by planning stalls to entertain families. This was such an enjoyable afternoon, some highlights including hunting for jelly beans in the baked beans, hook a duck and designing your own stickers!







In English, we wrote a newspaper report about a girl called Rose Blanche, who went missing in Germany, having been seen chasing a lorry into a forest. We then wrote an evacuee narrative in the first person. It was amazing to write as if we were an evacuee.

In Science, we learnt about the human body, most specifically, the circulatory system. We were taught that when you look at a diagram of a heart it is actually flipped around! We created a model of our blood using cheerios to represent red blood cells, marshmallows to represent white blood cells, yellow water to represent plasma and glitter to represent platelets.







As well as this, we enjoyed performing dances to our VIP guests in the 90th Anniversary assembly, to Great Balls of Fire and Mamma Mia.

Our DT week was a lot of fun, designing cushions and exploring materials with which to make them. We practiced our stitching techniques and came up with great products!







Summerside's 90th Anniversary

Wednesday 13th December was Summerside's 90th Anniversary. The school was opened in 1933 by the then Mayor of Finchley.

We had a very special assembly with all the children from Year 2 – Year 6 and some very important visitors which included the Mayor of Barnet, previous staff members and some ex-pupils. One of our ex-pupils was aged 94 years old.

During the assembly, the children spoke of the work that they had completed in History week in the Summer term. Each year group told us all about a decade in time and the events that took place at Summerside.

In between each year group speaking, we had a wonderful performance of a song from that decade.

Some of the songs were signed in BSL, some were sung by the children and our fantastic Year 6 children performed dances.




Summerside's Winter Fayre


Map Skills Day
